







The 2024-2025 Impact Report reflects the CMC Education Foundation's fiscal year from July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025. All numbers are preliminary & unaudited.

2024–2025 Education Foundation Accomplishments

Programs

- 1 The 16th annual **Pass & Go**, presented by **Wyatt Johnson Automotive Group** welcomed 894 students who passed 1,279 AP exams with a 3, 4, or 5. Northeast Junior Ethan Weller was the winner of a brand new Toyota Camry. Other winners walked away with gift cards from **Domino's** and **Beach Oil**, laptops from **Google**, and iPads from the foundation.
- 2 The **36th Annual Academic Awards Banquet** honored over 270 students and their parents with the annual dinner and awards presentation.
- 3 The **Partners In Education Breakfast** honored all the local businesses who go above and beyond. **Wyatt Johnson Automotive Group** was recognized as the Sarah Ditmore Cooper Outstanding Partner for 2024.
- 4 Sixty-six teachers were honored at the annual **Teacher of the Year Banquet**, presented by **Wyatt Johnson Automotive Group**. Two teachers walked away with a \$500 cash prize courtesy of the Foundation and Jaffa Williams won a fully-paid trip to Cabo San Lucas!
- 5 At the **Classified Employee of the Year** event, presented by **Clarksville Fencing**, 50 employees were recognized for their superior service. Danny Smith was selected as the District Classified Employee of the Year and took home the \$500 cash prize.

The inaugural Q up the Classroom radiothon, presented by **5 Star Media Group**, raised \$27,000 to help stock for the Teacher Warehouse. In 2024–2025, we offered over \$80,000 worth of school supplies to our CMCSS teachers.



The third annual Dash to Benefit 5K and Fun Run, presented by **CDE Lightband**, raised \$15,000 to help support initiatives like Morale Grants, Teacher of the Year, and Classified Employee of the Year.



The 4th annual Bash to Benefit, casino night, presented by **CDE Lightband**, raised \$40,000 to help support initiatives like Teacher Warehouse, scholarships, grants, and Academic Awards.



Over \$70,000 worth of **Morale Grants** were awarded to schools and departments to create fun activities for all staff. Morale Grants supported activities like food trucks, scavenger hunts, zen rooms, and treat trollies.



Over \$32,000 worth of **Big Idea and Great Idea Grants** were awarded to CMCSS educators for implementation of innovative ideas in their classrooms.
